DOMESTIC ABUSE AND CHILD PROTECTION

Will this course be useful to me in my job?

This course is relevant for practitioners who are providing a service (paid or unpaid) for families in the local community. This includes those who provide a service for adults who are parents or carers of children.

It is essential that participants have already undertaken both Awareness of Child Abuse and Neglect and Basic Awareness of Domestic Abuse (Now Domestic Abuse - Recognising and Responding) before applying for this course.

What will the course cover?

- Recognising the link between domestic abuse and the need to safeguard children and young people
- The range of effects on children and young people of experiencing domestic abuse in the family
- Different approaches to use when working with children who have experienced domestic abuse

Who will present the course?

The lead trainer will be Sue Thompson, Named Nurse for Safeguarding Children with a specialist role in relation to Domestic Abuse. We will also have input from another experienced practitioner, Lindsay Bridge around Protective Behaviours.

When will the course be held?

The course will be a full day (09.30-16.30 with registration and refreshments from 09.00) and held on:

- Tuesday 13th March 2012 – New Mill, Saltaire
